YOUTH PERFORMANCE OPPORTUNITIES FOR PRIVATE LESSONS

Performance Classes

The Conservatory encourages students of all levels to participate in these informal settings in which students play for their peers and teachers. Based on teacher recommendations, this class is a relaxed venue for students prior to a performance. An accompanist is provided for performance classes.

Studio Classes

Studio Classes are the last “lesson” of the first semester for private instruction students. The class builds confidence and motivates students in their private study within their studio. Studio classes are held by faculty for their students only.

Honors Recitals

These semi-annual recitals feature students who have demonstrated outstanding commitment and progress during the school year based on a teacher’s recommendation.

Year-End Recitals

Student recitals are held for family and friends at the end of the year. Performances take place at The Reformed Church of Bronxville and are presented as live concerts. Recital participation is highly recommended. Students prepare repertoire with the approval and guidance of the teacher.

Play-a-thon for Scholarship

In this annual event, students and faculty perform throughout the day to raise funds for the Conservatory scholarship and outreach programs. The play-a-thon is live streamed.

Outreach Concerts

Select students and faculty perform concerts throughout the year at community venues in Westchester and Fairfield Counties.

Recital Attire

Gentlemen – dress pants, shirt with collar, optional blazer and tie.

Ladies – dress, blouse and skirt or dress pants.

No jeans, sneakers or flip-flops allowed.

Recital Department

Recitals are important milestones for students developmentally. Concordia Conservatory offers many opportunities for students to share their musical accomplishments in a supportive environment. To encourage performers so that they can maintain attentiveness in a performance situation, please turn off cell phones. Please wait until hearing applause before entering a performance, and gently encourage very young audience members to participate in appropriate concert etiquette.

CONSERVATORY POLICIES

REGISTRATION, TUITION, AND FEES

The annual registration fee is non-refundable. The student (or parent/guardian) is financially responsible for all classes and lessons. Students enrolled in private lessons and year-long classes are registered for the entire academic year and will be billed automatically.

Tuition for year-long lessons and classes may be divided into one, two or monthly payments required at registration.

For 8-,16-week sessions, tuition is due in full before the first class or lesson.

Payment plans are available for all students. Please review and complete the registration form.

The lessons and classes for students with outstanding balances will be suspended until the account is paid in full.

The Conservatory reserves the right to cancel group classes due to insufficient enrollment. Tuition will be fully refunded.

PRIVATE INSTRUCTION

First time students are required to interview with the Executive Director prior to registration for teacher recommendation and scheduling. Call the Conservatory to schedule a placement interview.

ROLLING ADMISSIONS

Registration for new students will be accepted throughout the year on a space-available basis only. Private lesson and class tuition will be prorated accordingly.

CHANGE OF FACULTY

Concordia Conservatory's method of assigning faculty is designed to make the best possible match before studies begin. However, if a change is desired, a student (or parent/guardian) must contact the Executive Director to facilitate faculty changes.

WITHDRAWAL AND REFUNDS

Tuition is fully refunded if a student withdraws before the first lesson.

The student (or parent/guardian) is financially responsible for all classes and lessons as stated in "Registration, Tuition, and Fees."

Students who enroll for private lessons and classes designated as "year-long" are registered for the entire time period of the lessons or classes and are responsible for the financial commitment.

Students who enroll for classes designated 8 and 16 classes are registered for the entire time period of the classes and are responsible for the financial commitment.

In the case of prolonged illness (accompanied with a doctor’s note) or move, refunds are pro-rated as stated below.

All withdrawal requests must be made in writing to the Executive Director for review by the Advisory Board. Verbal requests cannot be accepted.

Postmarked prior to 1st scheduled class/lesson 100% of tuition

Postmarked prior to 4th scheduled class/lesson 75% of tuition

Postmarked prior to 8th scheduled class/lesson 50% of tuition

Postmarked prior to the 16th scheduled class/lesson No refunds given

RETURN CHECK FEE

There is a \$25 fee for returned checks.

CANCELLATIONS & MISSED LESSONS

The Conservatory office must be notified of all cancellations. For student absences, two individual lessons per semester can be rescheduled if the absence is due to student illness, religious observance, or extraordinary circumstances. There are no exceptions. The Conservatory must be notified 24 hours in advance of cancellation due to a religious observance or extraordinary circumstance, or by 8 am the day of a lesson when due to illness. Otherwise, the teacher is not required to make up the missed lesson. For teacher absences, students receive personal notification from the teacher and the lesson will be rescheduled. For unscheduled Conservatory closings such as snow closings, lessons and classes will be rescheduled. Group classes cannot be made up due to student illness.

SCHOOL CLOSINGS

In the event of inclement weather, Concordia Conservatory will send an email notification and will post on our website at concordiaconservatory.org the school closing information. Lessons will be given via remote/virtual instruction.

COMMUNICATION

E-mail is the primary mode of communication.

DEPARTMENT

Students are expected to treat the facilities respectfully. Pets are not allowed in Stein Hall. Parents, guardians and caregivers are responsible for supervising the safety of their children at all times while they are on the premises. All pick-up and drop-offs are required to be made in parking zones only.
